Please keep in mind some important information and dates:

- At time of registration Class fees are due (\$45for PK & K students and \$40 for students 1st-5th. This can be broken into 2 payments with the first due prior to school starting.
- TBD New students enrolling in our 1st through 5th grade will be given a placement test. Please call the front office to schedule a time.
- July 4th July 8th Front office will be closed for the summer.
- Front Office Summer Hours:
 8:30AM-4:00PM. Please call 817-496-3003 to schedule an after-

hours appointment.

- August 12th & 13th Meet the Teacher Conferences -9:00 AM to 3:00 PM - Your child(ren)'s teacher will schedule a virtual conference to get to know your family and to allow you to get to know him or her. These will be individual conferences with each family.
- August 16th— First Day of School— Children should bring their personal school supplies the first day of school in a childsized backpack. Students in Prek and Kindergarten may bring a light blanket that can fit in their backpack for nap time. Students in 2nd -5th grade may bring a personal device in a protective case.
- We are a closed campus for the first 10 days of school. This allows classrooms to normalize before visitors are allowed on campus.
- August 30th First day parents are welcomed to visit the classrooms.

PK Tuition

Our PK program is a tuition based program. This is for students who are 3 and 4 years old as of **September 1st**, 2020.

The tuition is collected in one (1) deposit of \$100 dollars and nine (9) equal payments of \$265 or \$525 (depending on eligibility)

The following is the payment schedule:

1st Payment - Due at time of registration and it is non-refundable

2nd Payment - September 1st

3rd Payment - October 1st

4th Payment - November 2nd

5th Payment - December 1st

6th Payment - January 5th

7th Payment - February 1st

8th Payment - March 1st

9th Payment - April 1st

10 Payment - May 3rd

Payments received AFTER the 10th of each month are subject to a \$25 late fee and students will be withdrawn until payment is received.

To be eligible for the reduced rate, a child must be at least three or four years of age by September 1st of the current school year <u>and</u> meet at least <u>ONE</u> of the criteria listed below:

- Be unable to speak and comprehend the English language
 (must take a test from our ESL department; please call front office to schedule time)
- Be educationally disadvantaged, which means a student eligible to participate in the national free or reduced-price lunch program (must fill out Socioeconomic form and provide most recent pay stub or income tax if self-employed)
- Be homeless, as defined by 42
 United States Code (U.S.C.)
 Section 1143a, regardless of
 the residence of the child, of
 either parent of the child, or
 of the child's guardian or other
 person having lawful control of
 the child
- Be the child of an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States, including the state military forces or a reserve component of the armed forces, who is ordered to active duty by proper authority (must provide parent military ID);
- Be the child of a member of the armed forces of the United States, including the state military forces or a reserve component of the armed forces, who was injured or killed while serving on active duty;
- Be in, or have been in, the con-

servatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) following an adversary hearing held as provided by Section 262.201, Family Code; Be the child of a person eligible for the Star of Texas Award as a peace officer (3106.002), firefighter (3106.003), or emergency medical first responder (3106.004) (must provide letter from DFPS).

Student Handbook

The student handbook is located on our website or you can request a paper copy in the front office. Please take the time to review the student handbook and our grading policy. The following are a few highlights from the handbook:

- The first ten (10) days of school, EFWMA does not allow parents into the classroom so the students can acclimate to a new environment. This ten day (10) period is mandatory for parents enrolling their children during the school year.
- Prescription medications administered during school hours must be prescribed by a physician or advanced nurse practitioner ("ANP") and filled by a pharmacist licensed in the State of Texas.
- Medical Forms are available in the front office for the following conditions: Asthma Plan, and/or Epi Pen, and an Authorization form to dis-

pense medication. Please make sure to fill out the appropriate form (s) for your student (s).

Shoes - Athletic shoes, loafers, dress shoes or other closed toe shoes.

Belts - Belts must be worn by students in 3rd - 5th grades.

The uniform policy will be enforced starting the first day of school.

Parents will be asked to take student home and return in appropriate uniform.

Pre - K through 2nd grade wear red shirts and navy bottoms.





3rd through 5th grade wear light blue shirts and khaki bottoms.





Logo sweaters are the only sweaters allowed in the classroom settings.

If your child is in the K-2 or 3-5 Leadership Prep Programs, please keep in mind they require a different color and logo uniform.
