From the Desk of the Principal

We had a great start to the school year! Parents, this is in no small part due to your active partnership with the school! Thank you for all you do to help your child be their best each day! 66 A new school year means new beginnings, new adventures, new friendships, and new challenges. The slate is clean and anything can happen."

Here are some highlights I'd like to share:

- By the second week of school our average daily tardies decreased from 10 to just 3! Way to go, parents and students! The best time to drop your child off is between 7:15 and 7:30. This allows them to fully participate in FREE breakfast and Morning Meeting.
- Dismissal has increased in efficiency drastically. I know some days have been more challenging than others, but on average we are clearing the line by 3:45 or 3:50. We do have parents who arrive after that point, but the line is moving much quicker and 90% of students are dismissed by this point. Awesome job to our parents and dismissal team!
- Primary had a successful All About Me Parent Engagement Event! Way to go, Primary Team!
- The Link has repeatedly complemented the manners and behavior of our students! Great job, 2nd-5th Grade Students and Teachers!

There are somethings we need ALL parents to do.

- All parents must attend a mandatory Family Partnership Conference. These conferences set the tone for the school year and ensure that home and school are working together.
- Please sign into your child's google classroom. This is one way you can see your child's assignments and grades. It is also the best way to remain "in the know" about what is happening in your child's class.
- Please ensure you can access Parent Portal. Teachers will begin entering grades this week. The first two weeks are used for procedures, review, and practice so that grades moving forward accurately represent student knowledge and not summer slide.
- Please check to see that your information is the most up to date and best contact information. We are still getting returned emails and text messages when we send out mass communication.
- Please make sure you are receiving Remind messages from your child's teacher. This is the best way to communicate quickly and directly with your child's teacher. They will also communicate with you through this platform frequently.
- Please add our Parent & Community Calendar to your Google Calendar. Just click the button below this section to add it to your existing calendar.

We are looking forward to another great month of school. Some things to look forward to in September include:

- **3rd-5th Grade Students.** During Morning Meeting these students have been asked to partner with younger students. They are helping these younger students learn our school mission and mantra. Soon they will begin working as teams to develop some community projects all students can participate in as we learn about our 6 Pillars of Character.

We will wrap up our explorations of what it means to be compassionate this month and begin to learn what it means to be a person of integrity. We encourage you to explore these topics with your children at home as well!

What to do in the event of a COVID exposure or positive COVID test:

Please call the front office or email your child's teacher immediately upon knowing your child will be out sick so that we can make the appropriate arrangements.

At E.F.W.M.A., we will provide Remote Conferencing instruction to any student who must remain at home due to medical reasons, but is not too sick to learn remotely. Alerting the school as soon as possible is one way you actively partner with us in your child's academic growth.

The schedule is below:

8:00-9:05 Settle In & Math Instruction 2:00-3:00 Reading Instruction & Optimistic Closure

We have committed from the beginning to be transparent about all instances of the coronavirus that directly affect our community. We ask that you also be transparent with us. If your child or anyone in your family has been exposed, begins to show symptoms, or tests positive for COVID-19, we ask that you notify the school immediately. Each situation is unique and will be treated with confidentiality and respect. We will complete the required contract tracing, make the best possible instructional arrangements for the students affected, and alert our community of any potential risks.

Students who must miss school due to COVID or any other medical reason that requires them to stay home have the opportunity to attend Remote Conferencing sessions. These sessions will be tailored to the child and their assignments. The staff member working with the student will continue our character education program and will assist the student with assignments. They will also help the student review their agenda for the day and ensure they know the schedule and how to attend any classes or intervention sessions. In order to receive attendance for the day the students must attend a minimum of two hours of Remote Conferencing instruction. Obviously, we do not want any child to feel compelled to attend if they are too sick to work.

E.F.W.M.A. continues to implement many safety precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other illnesses, including an increased cleaning routine, strongly recommending all staff and students wear masks, and social distancing when possible. We consistently open windows for fresh air and encourage classes to eat and work in the outdoors when not too hot. We wash hands more often than we use hand sanitizer, but hand sanitizer is always available. We talk to our students about the importance of correctly washing hands at regular intervals throughout the day and after using the restroom or using a tissue. We ask that you practice the safety precautions you want your child to use at school at home. This builds muscle memory and ensures your child understands your expectations.
